Established on August 9, 1971, the college is located in Subha, a model village in the Chenga-Bahari area on the eastern edge of Barpeta district (formerly part of the undivided Kamrup district). The village is mainly inhabited by tribal people, which adds to the college's diverse student body.

Initially sanctioned for ad-hoc grants in 1977, the college was taken over under the deficit system of Grant-In-Aid in 1979. Since then, it has grown steadily, becoming affiliated with Gauhati University (presently at Bhattadev University) and gaining recognition under sections 2(F) and 12(B) of the UGC Act in 2009. It has also been made a provincialized college of Assam through the Assam College Provincialization Act of 2005. Thanks to its strategic location near the char areas, the college attracts students from a wide region.

Madhya Kamrup College's success is a testament to the dedication of its teaching and non-teaching staff, the hard work of its students, and the unwavering support from the local community. The college has become a landmark institution, known for its quality education and contribution to the development of the surrounding areas. LOCATION OF THE COLLEGE

Buses and other mini vehicles to Chenga are available from Adabari and Guwahati ISBT Bus Stand. Nearest Railway station –Barpeta Road is nearly 40 km. away from the college. Madhya Kamrup College is one of the premier institutions of higher education for boys and girls in one of the traditionally enlightened districts of Assam. It was established at village Subha which is now a model village mostly inhabited by tribal people and located in the Chenga- Bahari area at the East-end of Barpeta district (formerly undivided Kamrup district of Assam).

FACILITIES AVAILABLE

CLASS ROOM

Sufficient numbers of class rooms including digital classroom of varying sizes are available for the smooth conduct of different classes in the college.

LABORATORIES

Two laboratories for Anthropology and Education department with sufficient space and all the necessary equipments are available in the college.

LANGUAGE LAB.

The college has a language laboratory funded by Rashtriya Uchchatar Siksha Abhiyan (RUSA) to facilitate efficient teacher-student interaction to correct phonetic accents and dialects to be effectively used for business and official communication.





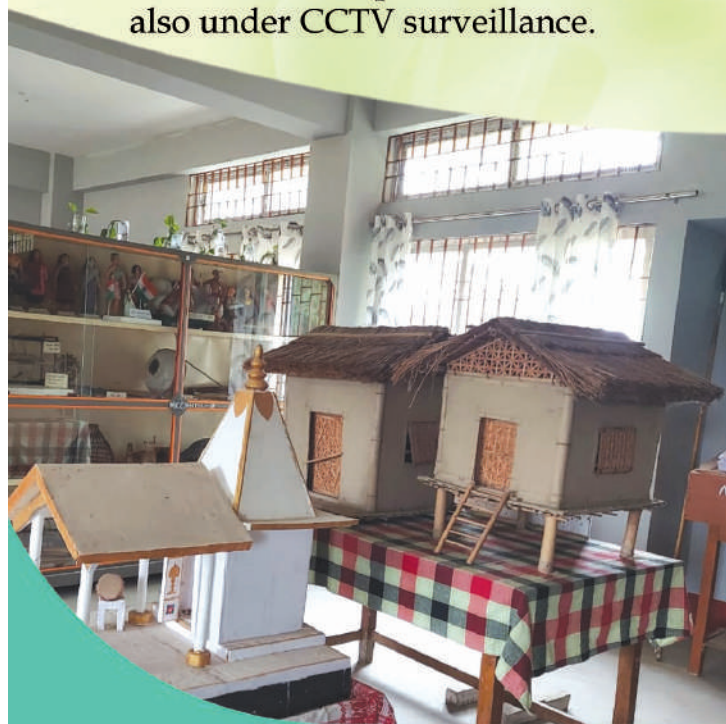
LIBRARY

Madhya Kamrup College has a central library and reading room. It remains open during working hours. Students and teachers may borrow books from the library against Library card. Books can be photocopied in the library itself. The central library has a collection of more than 31,700 printed books. A good number magazine, Departmental journals and news papers are subscribed by the library which has also got a rare reference book collection. The library is automated and there is also a computer lab for teachers & students. The Central Library also embraces the digital age with access to N-LIST and ONOS subscriptions, offering a vast range of e-journals and e-books to ensure that learners are always just a click away from the latest research and publications. Complementing these resources is a Digital Library, designed to foster a modern reading and research experience. The central library is also under CCTV surveillance.



BOOK BANK

The college has a book bank facility for helping the poor and backward students.



MUSEUM

The college has one museum in the department of Anthropology. They boast of rich collection of artefacts and different cultural items of high value. The basic objective is to highlight the rich ethno-cultural heritage of Assam in particular and North-East India in general.



INTERNET & WI-FI

The college has internet facilities in all the departments including the library and college office. Besides WI-FI facilities is also available for all in the college.



AUDIO VISUAL AID

Madhya Kamrup College possesses overhead projectors, LCD projectors, laptops which are used for teaching- learning, seminars and conferences.



CANTEEN

A canteen for Students, Teachers & Non-teaching staff is available in the college and remains open during working hours.

SPORTS AND GYM FACILITIES

The college has a large playground and an Indoor Stadium where a good number of sports equipment is available besides that the college has a well equipped Gymnasium Hall for student & faculty members to improve their physical development.





SCHOLARSHIP

Students belonging to SC/ST/OBC/MOBC are awarded scholarships as per Govt. rule. This includes merit scholarships like Ishan uday and Pragyan Bharati and many others Govt. schemes are available in our institution.

STUDY TOUR, EXCURSION AND FIELD TRIPS

Facilities for Study Tour, Excursion and Field Trips are available for the students of our College if fund is available. Field trip is complementary to the Environmental Studies and department of Anthropology.



REMEDIAL COACHING FOR EDUCATIONALLY DISADVANTAGES GROUP

The college provides remedial/tutorial classes for the benefit of educationally disadvantaged students of FYUGP Classes, particularly the unsuccessful ones.

ENTRY INTO OTHER SERVICES

Special coaching classes are offered to students and employees and local youths (subject to availability of fund) for entry into services like Banking, Civil Services etc.



ALTERNATIVE HEALTH CARE FACILITY

The college has introduced an Alternative Health Care Facility for benefits of the local inhabitants of the surrounding area. This may be realized by availing the facility of V3 Bed-Gold Plus Version, a fully automatic thermal spine therapy bed used for addressing the problems related to spinal inconveniences and related mental and physical anxieties as well as pressures. This heavy duty automatic Korean Carefit V3 therapy-bed has sound therapy system with inbuilt speakers along with latest 3D Advance Acupressure System and is heavily used to ensuring freshness through relaxation of both mind and body of the patient. A considerable number of people have already taken advantage of this facility and it is hoped that all the assiduous and conscientious people from the local char areas in this region will be much benefitted from this service provided by the College.



PROVISION FOR POWER GENERATOR

Madhya Kamrup College possesses a silent Generator and provide electricity at the time of power cut. So that essential teaching -learning and official work can go on smoothly.

Madhya Kamrup College has the distinction of organizing rallies, procession and publicity drives in the locality which are aimed at removal of illiteracy, superstition, untouchability and for increasing awareness about health, hygiene and preservation of the environment etc. Keeping in mind the college proposes to adoption of a village and schools through NSS and IQAC of the college. This is a very meaningful programme for the same. It is far better to Concentrate attention on one village and take up the task for development perspective, than to fritter away energy in many locations involving too many activities which may not be completed at all or where the follow up action may not be possible. From this point of view, village adoption programme should ensure continuity of work vis-à-vis sustained action, evaluation and follow up work.



COURSES OF STUDY

The College offers the privilege of imparting studies in Arts faculty, both in Two Years Higher Secondary programme (HS) in Arts & four years Under Graduate programme (FYUGP) under the aegis of Assam Higher Secondary Education Council and Bhattadev University respectively.

The curriculum options in our College are as follows :

A. HIGHER SECONDARY (ARTS) : Seat Limit : Total – 300

Eligibility : HSLC pass/ CBSE Class X Exam. Pass/CISCE Exam. Pass.

Structure : HS first year & HS second year.

HS 1st year : Two Unit Test are conducted by the college during the year. Annual Examination is conducted by the ASSEB at the end of the course.

HS 2nd year : Two Unit Tests including Test Examination before the final examination are conducted by the college. Final Examination is conducted by the ASSEB at the end of the course.

In the HS Level, Students may offer four optional subjects (one from each group), out of which, one automatically becomes the fourth subject in which they secure the least mark. (seat limit 100 for group 'A', 'B', 'C' subjects and 50 for group 'D' subject).

From the academic session 2023-24 Bhattadev University has introduced the Four Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP). The course shall be of Eight Semesters and is categorised primarily into three- Core, multi disciplinary, ability enhancement, valueadded, Skill Enhancement and internship courses. A student need to earn the required number of credits in order to successfully complete a degree for FYUGP under BU

REGISTRATION

Registration is compulsory for all students. They are to submit prescribed forms for registration immediately after admission under ASSEB and Affiliating University respectively.

ATTENDANCE

It is compulsory for every student to attend classes regularly and punctually (either off-line or online). Wilful absence from the class will be treated as a serious breach of college discipline. Each student is required to attend a minimum number of class as prescribe by Affiliating University & ASSEB failing which a student will not be allowed to appear in the examinations.

ACADEMIC REGULATION

The college follows the academic regulations prescribed by ASSEB and Affiliating University being in force from time to time in respect of concerned courses.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. No entry without college uniform and identity card.
2. Ragging is a punishable offence under the Indian Penal Code (IPC). The Hon'ble Supreme Court of India has ordered all universities and their affiliated colleges under the University Grants Commission (UGC) that if any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority, the students involved in ragging shall be given liberty to explain and if his/her explanation is not found satisfactory, the authority would expel him/her from the institution (UGC letter No. F.1-8/2006 (CPP-II) February, 2008).
